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WHITE WINE - GRAPES

Ansonica

Inzolia Wine (or Ansonica) is an Italian grape variety grown in both Sicily and Tuscany. It is seen as a crisp, dry white wine. Inzolia wines are moderately aromatic, and tend to display nutty, citrusy characters with herbal notes.

Assyrtiko

Assyrtiko (also written Assyrtico or Asyrtiko) is arguably Greece's most iconic wine grape variety.

Gaia Thalassitis Dry White has medium intensity aromas of lemon, very fresh and smells like sand and salt. It has high acidity with incredible freshness that really represents the terroir in Santorini.

Cabernet Sauvignon

Cabernet Sauvignon is probably the most famous red wine grape variety on Earth. Cabernet Sauvignon wines have common character traits: deep color, good tannin structure, moderate acidity and aromas of blackcurrant, tomato leaf, dark spices and cedarwood.

Carricante

Carricante is an ancient white wine grape variety from eastern Sicily. The variety is known for its marked acidity, and the high yields which gave rise to its name (carica means "load" in Italian).

Chenin Blanc

Chardonnay – Chenin Blanc blended wines are made from two of France's most well-respected cool-climate varieties. Both Chardonnay and Chenin Blanc are high in acid. Chenin Blanc is the principal variety in these wines, with Chardonnay used to add some weight. These wines show honeyed aromas, backed by creamy, green-apple flavors, often with a hint of hazelnut.

Cortese

Cortese is a white grape variety that is most famous for its role in the crisp, lime-scented wines of Gavi. The variety is known for its bracingly high acidity and its ability to retain freshness. Apple, peach and honeydew flavors are commonly associated with Cortese wine, with lime, almond and light herbal or grassy aromas.

Fiano

Fiano is a high-quality, white-wine grape variety used widely in southern Italy. Used mainly as a varietal wine, Fiano is nutty and textured with floral and honeyed notes, spice and tropical fruit flavors like pineapple.

Garganega

Garganega is best known for its dry wines. Both Soave and Gambellara produce such wines. When made in this style, both Soave and Garganega wines are richly textured and have concentrated aromas of honey, candied lemon peel, tropical fruits and sweet spices.

Gelber Muskateller

Gelber Muskateller This is a very old variety that dates back to the ancient world. Delivers wines with a more or less intense nutmeg aroma and flavour. With too little ripeness, the wines are low in extract and therefore thin and with intrusive acidity. The Muskateller is especially delicious as an apéritif and with appetizers.

Gewurtztraminer

Gewurtztraminer (Gewürztraminer in German-language areas) is a grape variety that produces some of the world's most distinctive aromatic wines. Its perfumed style is somewhat polarizing; fans adore its intense floral scent and sweet-spice flavors, while detractors lament its low acidity and lack of subtlety.

Pinot Gris

Pinot Gris is a white-wine grape originally from the vineyards of Burgundy. Common features include notes of pears, apples, stonefruit, tropical fruit, sweet spices and even a hint of smoke or wet wool. Most winemakers avoid obvious oak character in their Pinot Gris, but some use older more neutral barrels for fermentation.

Malvasia

Malvasia is an ancient family of grapes that includes a diverse collection of noble varieties. These grapes are capable of producing wine of any feasible color in dry, sparkling and sweet styles.

Nascetta

Nascetta is an exquisite grape that produces wines that are assertively perfumed with Muscat-like floral qualities that lead to riper, tropical fruit aromas. It also has a fresh palate, with crisp apple flavors and citrus and honey.

Riesling

Riesling is a light-skinned, aromatic grape of German origin. Riesling is an aromatic grape variety displaying flowery, almost perfumed, aromas as well as high acidity.

Sauvignon Blanc

Sauvignon Blanc is a white-wine grape from western France, now successfully grown in emerging and established wine regions all over the world. Classic Sauvignon Blanc aromas range from grass, nettles, blackcurrant leaf and asparagus to green apples and gooseberries, and to more esoteric notes such as cats' pee and gunflint.

Shiraz/Syrah

Shiraz is the name given to the dark-skinned Syrah grape when grown in Australia and selected pockets of the New World. . The prevailing style of Shiraz tends toward bright fruit flavors, most frequently blueberries, blackcurrants and black cherries. Secondary notes of chocolate often accented by pepper and spicy inflections.

Timorasso

Timorasso is an ancient Piedmontese grape variety that was on the verge of extinction in the 1980s. Wines made from the Timorasso grape variety tend to be full-bodied with good acidity that can show tropical fruit in some examples and more floral notes in others.

Torbato

Torbato (Tourbat in France) is a Mediterranean white-wine grape variety now grown exclusively in northwest Sardinia. The wine is straw colored with good structure, typically crisp and dry with a small proportion of barrel maturation to add richness. Distinctive flinty and mineral flavors, even smokiness.

Trebbiano

Trebbiano is a name applied to a group of white wine grape varieties originating in Italy. They do share some traits; the most basic one being that they are all white varieties. It can be fresh and fruity, but does not keep long.

Verduzzo

The Verduzzo name may refer to two distinct white wine varieties of northeastern Italy. They are usually powerful, with a deep golden color, and can have noticeable tannins and a herbal character when young. They often benefit from a couple of years of aging.

Vermentino

Vermentino is a white-wine grape grown in various locations around the western Mediterranean: wines are crispy fresh and rich in minerality due to the Carrara marble quarries present in the region.

Viosinho

Viosinho is a high-quality white-wine grape variety from northeastern Portugal.

RED WINE - GRAPES

Aragonez

Alicante Bouschet – Aragonez (or Tempranillo) is a common red wine blend used in southern Portugal. In this now-classic Portuguese red wine blend, Alicante Bouschet contributes soft texture and desirable color, while Aragonez contributes power, structure and complex red-fruit aromatics.

Barbera

Barbera is a dark-skinned wine grape variety found in several Italian wine regions. This acidity complements the cherry flavors found in typical Barbera wines and has contributed to the stereotype of Italian red wines as being ripe, bright and tangy rather than voluptuous and earthy.

Cabernet Franc

Cabernet Franc is a black-skinned French wine grape variety grown in most wine producing nations. It appears in blended red wines, where it adds herbaceous accents of tobacco and dark spice. Its varietal wines are light to medium bodied and often show vegetal characteristics, in particular green bell peppers.

Cabernet Sauvignon

Cabernet Sauvignon is probably the most famous red wine grape variety on Earth. The classic profile of Cabernet Sauvignon tends to be full-bodied wines with high tannins and noticeable acidity. Cabernet Sauvignon tends to produce wines with blackcurrant notes that can be accompanied by green bell pepper notes, mint and cedar.

Blaufränkisch

Blaufränkisch (aka Lemberger and Kékfrankos) is a black-skinned wine grape grown widely in Austria and Hungary. The common feature in these wines is a fruit-forward profile with aromas of spiced black cherries.

Carménère

Carménère is a dark-skinned grape variety originally from the vineyards of Bordeaux, and which has found a particularly suitable home in Chile. It produces fine, deeply colored red wines, with the attractive meaty plumpness of Merlot and the gently herbaceous, cedary notes of Cabernet Sauvignon.

Cannonau

The grape variety Cannonau is local to the Italian island of Sardinia. Cannonau is characterised by a medium alcohol level, soft acidity and red fruit flavours (raspberry and strawberry) alongside subtle floral and white pepper spice notes.

Corvinone

Corvinone is a red grape variety grown in the northeast Italy. Opaque ruby in the glass. Notes of ripe red plumb and baked cherries, roasted coffee and bitter cocoa. Aged 3 years in barrel prior to bottling. Extraordinary grape.

Dolcetto

Dolcetto is a dark-skinned wine grape from northwestern Italy. Dolcetto produces soft-styled, fruity wines with colors varying from deep ruby to purple. They are characterized particularly by their low acidity.

Garnacha

Grenache (Garnacha) is a red-wine grape grown extensively in France, Spain, Australia and the United States. It is generally spicy, berry-flavored and soft on the palate and produces wine with a relatively high alcohol content. Characteristic flavor profiles include red fruit flavors (raspberry and strawberry) with, white pepper spice note.

Grignolino

Grignolino is a red-wine grape from the Monferrato hills of Piedmont. This pale red wine makes light colored wines with very fruity aromas, strong acidity and tannins.

Lambrusco

Lambrusco is a brightly colored grape variety used to make sparkling red wines in Emilia-Romagna, northern Italy. This bubbly red is energetic, full of life. With its seemingly weightless texture and concentrated flavors of , leather, bruised blueberry, plum and dusty herbs, this gem could accompany any meal imaginable.

Lagrein

Lagrein is an ancient grape variety that finds its home in the sunny vineyards of Trentino-Alto Adige in northeastern Italy. Its wines are strong and full bodied with plum and wild cherry flavors, and is well known for the deep, dense color. Lagrein has acidic structure and a slightly astringent finish, making it best paired with food.

Mataro

Mourvèdre (also known as Mataró or Monastrell) is a red wine grape variety grown in many regions around the world including Australia. The variety is also used to make rosé and port-style fortified wines. Mourvèdre tends to produce tannic wines that can be high in alcohol.

Merlot

Merlot is a red wine grape variety from France. Plum and black cherry are among the most common fruit-based descriptors used, though it is often used for producing wines of a particular texture, rather than a particular taste. Smooth, rounded and "easy drinking" are common descriptions of Merlot wines.

Montepulciano

Montepulciano is a red wine grape variety grown widely in central Italy. Globally appreciated for their soft flavors, strong color and gentle tannins, these wines are typically best consumed in their youth and with food. It is an easy to drink light red. Very smooth with blackberries, vanilla and a hint of rosemary both on the nose and the palate.

Mourvedre

Mourvedre (Monastrell in its native Spain, Mataro in Australia and California) is a black-skinned variety. Mourvedre wines taste: herby aromas are very distinctive, as are its strong tannins.

Nebbiolo

Nebbiolo is the grape variety behind the top-quality red wines of northwestern Italy, the most notable of which are Barolo and Barbaresco. Nebbiolo wines are distinguished by their strong tannins, high acidity and distinctive vanilla and oak scent.

Verdot

Petit Verdot is a red wine grape whose small, thick-skinned berries are valued for their depth of color. Petit Verdot wines tend to have a dense, inky, violet-black appearance. They also have high tannin levels, thanks to the small berries – specifically their high ratio of skin and seeds to juice with deep flavour of cassis, licorice and earth.

Pinot Noir

Pinot Noir is the dominant red wine grape of Burgundy, now adopted all over the world. The essence of Pinot Noir wine is its aroma of red berries and cherry. Many of the more complex examples show hints of forest floor. Well built Pinot Noirs, particularly from warmer harvests, suggest leather and violets, sometimes recalling Syrah.

Pinotage

Pinotage is South Africa's signature grape variety. They are wines with flavors of black and red fruits, spice, leather and chocolate. Pinotage Kanonkop has intense nose of oak, red fruit, black plum, cherry, toast. Full body, long finish, high tannins. Amazing.

Rioja

Rioja is a red blend of Tempranillo and Garnacha (Grenache) and they are produced in a vast range of styles that range from easy-drinking, to well-matured. Naturally, The wines are always dry. The Rioja wine taste is generally packed with red fruit flavors, spiciness and a slight burning sensation from the wine's high alcohol levels.

Rustenberg

The crown jewel of South Africa's wine industry. This wine is delicious and well worth decanting, it really opens up the smoky/Tabacco dark fruit flavour and softens the tannins to a fantastic counter point.

Sangiovese

Sangiovese), a dark-berried vine, is the most widely planted grape variety in Italy. Brunello di Montalcino is a red DOCG Italian wine produced in Tuscany. Today it is one of Italy's best-known and most expensive wines. This wine is Delightful at nose of young red fruits, leather, earth, oak and vanilla spice. Young red fruits with an intense floral nose of balsam, leather, barnyard, and silky tannins.
